General Summary of Position:

This is a full time (.75 FTE), hourly, non-exempt position, with typical on-site hours of 11:00 am - 5:00 pm, M-F, throughout the 10 month school year. The assistant's responsibilities will include but are not limited to the following:

- Help to support, prepare and maintain the primary Montessori environments for students aged 3-6.
- In close collaboration with our experienced faculty, implement the curriculum in a way that is consistent with Montessori theory, as promulgated by AMI.



- Utilize observation, reflection and refinement of work to best support independent activity through preparing developmentally appropriate and engaging activities
- Partner with students, teachers and parents across the children's house community to nurture and assess student development in all areas (social, emotional, cognitive, physical & moral)
- Model integrity, curiosity, and respect
- Attend staff meetings and trainings, as required

Desired Qualifications:

- High School Diploma and some college level coursework
- Minimum one year of experience working with children ages 1-3.
- Passion for early childhood development and working with young children and their families
- Motivation and ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Have a caring disposition and respect for the developmental needs of students
- Positive attitude and a commitment to serving the school community
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills

Preferred Qualifications include:

- Bachelor's Degree in Early Childhood Education or other education related field
- Current Infant/Child CPR and First Aid certification
- Completion of Montessori Assistant Training
